Fiscal Year 2022 Annual Report



Dear Friends of the Natick Service Council:

As we close out the Natick Service Council's Fiscal Year 2021-2022, we are pleased to present you with this Annual Report of the Council's activities and accomplishments. As all of us continued to work our way through the disruptive impacts to our daily lives brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic and its variants, the important work of NSC carried on in providing critical assistance and services to our clients – which were needed more than ever.

Through the generosity of our individual donors, foundations, and local organizations, we were able to **support 766 families in our Natick Community** and continued our commitment to helping our neighbors as we slowly emerged from the pandemic. Thank you to all who donated their time and resources in this effort.

In FY 2020-2021, as we worked to ensure the safety of our clients, staff, and volunteers — while at the same time continuing to provide much-needed services — we were required to take a number of preventative steps, some drastic, that proved challenging to all. Our volunteer support program was suspended; the pantry and office doors closed, and critical face-to-face program and service contacts with our clients were all but eliminated. Being forced to take these disruptive safety measures during this time of greatest need was heartbreaking. But, through hard work and improvisation, NSC was able to deliver groceries to homes, arrange for parking lot pick-ups, and slowly reinstate in-person shopping in our Heart Healthy Food Pantry. Through it all, help was there for those neighbors who were most in need.

We are very happy to report that FY 2022, while still challenging, was in all ways much better for the Natick Service Council and our clients. First and foremost, we were able to welcome back our selfless and dedicated volunteers, which in turn enabled us to return to in-person shopping at the Vi Tutuny Heart Healthy food pantry, facilitating 3,426 client visits, and to reopen and expand Harriet's Closet, offering clothes shopping to 128 families. In addition, our extraordinary NSC staff members returned to performing the work that they love and provided over 327 families with financial aid to pay rent or utilities and, through the Brack Career Center, assisted in the search for meaningful employment to 84 clients. NSC also rejoined the community through participation in Natick Days, the Farmers' Market, and other community activities and partnerships.

In addition, much of our time during FY 2022 was spent looking beyond the impacts of COVID-19, to focus on the future of NSC through the **development of a new strategic plan for the next three to five years.** The NSC board of directors and staff, in collaboration with ESC of New England, a voluntary team of experienced non-profit leaders, carefully analyzed the organization's vision and mission and identified five specific strategic imperatives to pursue in the areas of programming, development, operational excellence, messaging, and diversity, equity and inclusion. Our goal is to put in place a tactical plan designed to (1) sustain the meaningful and successful services that we currently have; (2) expand to areas where critical unmet needs exist; and (3) have available the resources needed to ensure that we are able to continue to provide life-changing services to those most vulnerable in our Natick community.

As we enter the 60th anniversary year of our existence, we at NSC remain forever grateful to all of those who have supported the organization and its mission over the years. We are also very excited about the opportunities ahead. For this coming fiscal year, look for some new programming, including a transportation offering to address the number one unmet need identified by our clients. Most importantly, as we embark on the next 60 years, it is thanks to your on-going support, dedication and encouragement that the Natick Service Council can, and will, remain strong and committed to the mission of Neighbors helping Neighbors!




