Together, we can overcome any challenge and continue to make Natick a place we are all proud to call home.

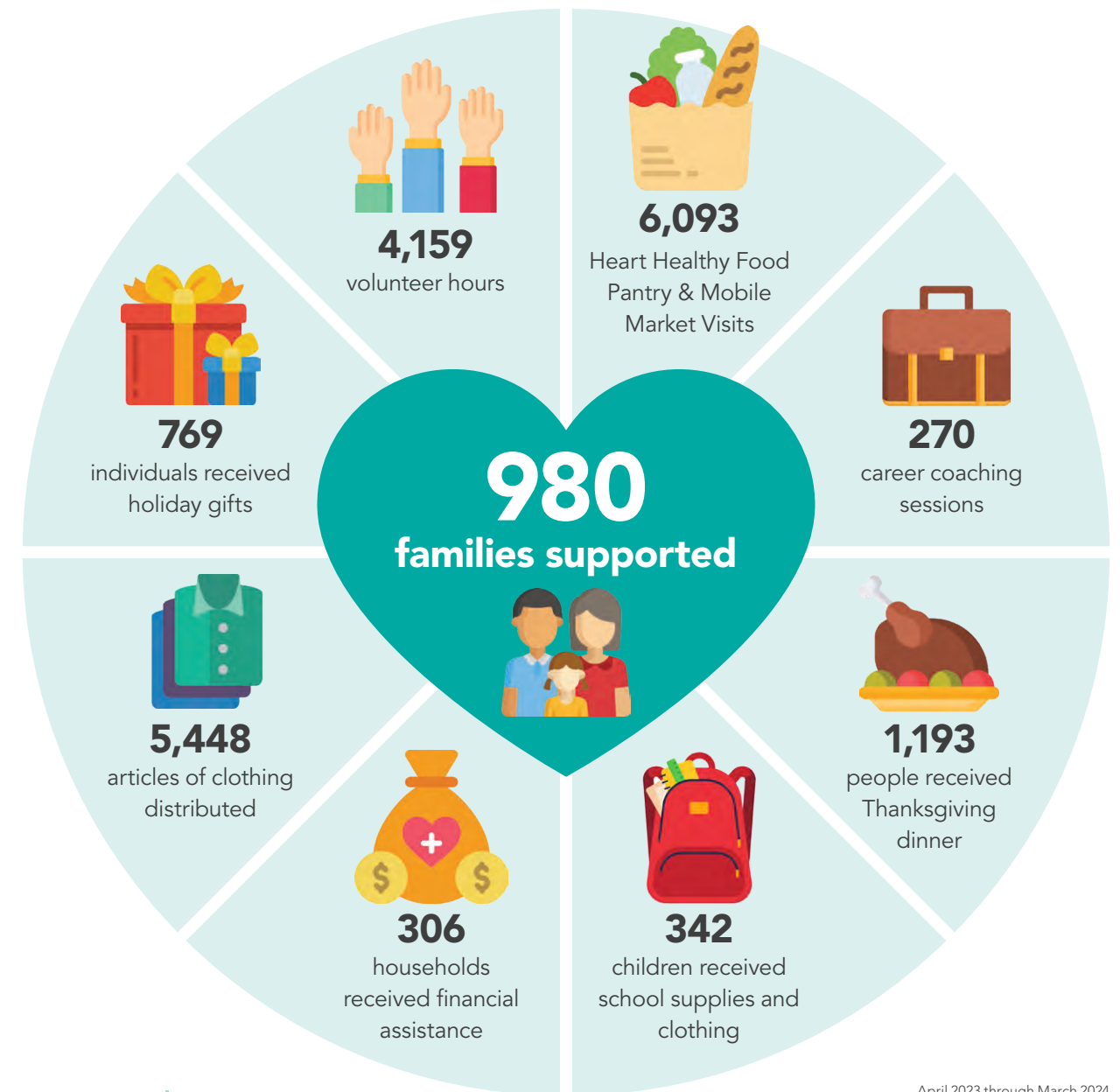

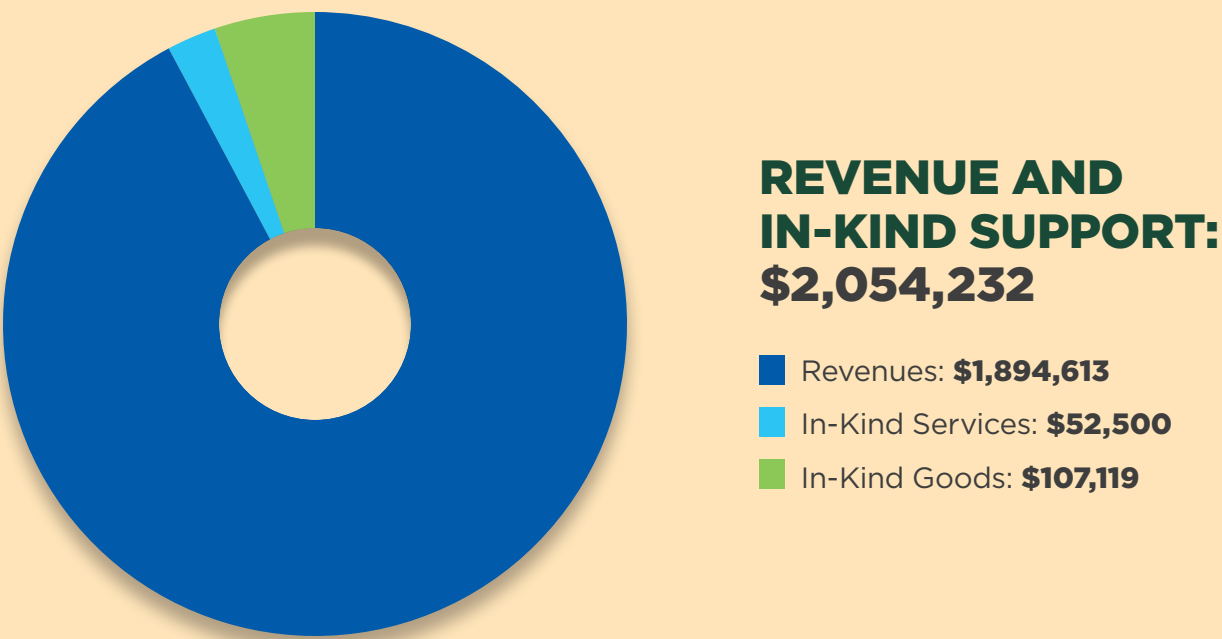
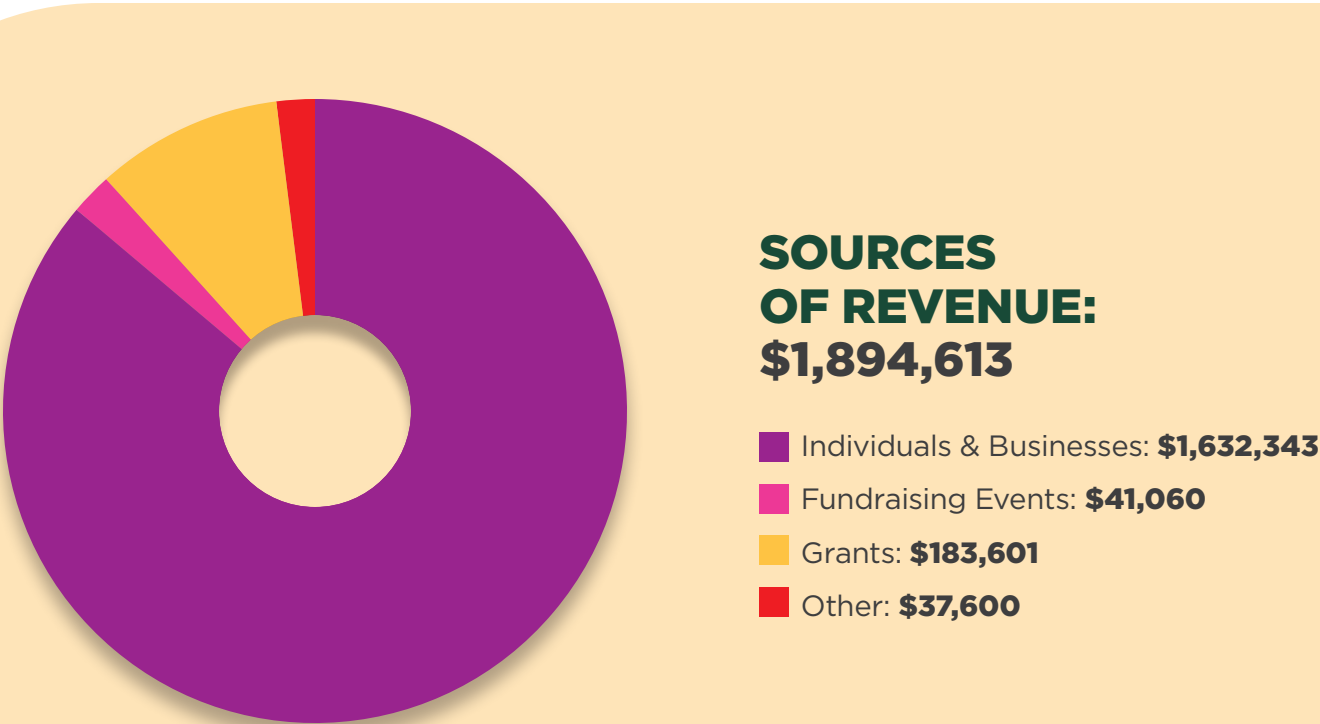

Thanks to our donors' generosity, Natick Service Council can provide our neighbors in need access to a variety of services all year long. With that incredible support, we have helped over 2,050 people over the course of the year.

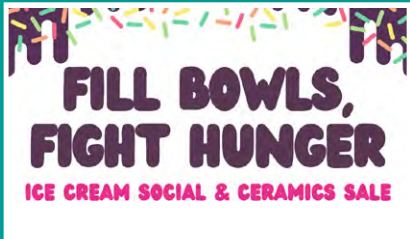
